## Thursday-Saturday, 6-8 November 2025

**Call for Papers:** You are invited to submit short position papers on any aspect of Thomas More's writings related to his understanding of government and its effects. Papers exploring literary, philosophical, historical, political, theological, rhetorical, legal, or cultural dimensions of More's treatment of government are welcome. Papers related to More's effect on later thinkers, especially on the Founders of the U.S.A (such as Hamilton in Federalist Paper #6), would also be welcome

**Common texts we will use:** *The Essential Works of Thomas More* (Yale UP, 2020), but Gerald Malsbary's new translation of More's Latin *Richardi Tertii* and the CTMS translations of *Utopia* and the Epigrams. See https://thomasmorestudies.org/teaching/.

Accepted papers will be distributed to the other members of your seminar group, and **each participant agrees to read the others' papers of your seminar group before** coming in November. The **maximum length** is ten double-spaced pages. Since we are using the seminar format, attendance is limited.
