# Reappraising Book 2 of Utopia

# Thursday-Saturday, 5-7 November 2026

## Draft 11/14/2025

Call for Papers: We welcome papers exploring any specific aspect of Book 2 of Thomas More's *Utopia*. All papers should focus primarily on materials in Book 2 itself, analyzing that text closely. Papers could analyze specific institutions and customs related to government, economics, education, religion, marriage, law and treaties, foreign policy, family, music, slavery, ethics, crime and punishment, war, Utopia's founding, etc. Papers could also address large issues such as how this "philosophic city" (*Utopia* 9.11) works, or how and what it teaches concerning republican government. Is there, for example, a dialectical dimension to book 2 that makes *Utopia* 2 truly philosophical? If so, how is that dimension shown? In what way is *Utopia* "a rival to Plato's city, perhaps its victor" (*Utopia* 7.30)?

**Common text we will use:** *Utopia and Selected Epigrams* (CTMS Publishers, 2023) – available in English and Latin through <a href="https://www.thomasmorestudies.org">www.thomasmorestudies.org</a> along with Study Guide; ISBN 9798218149123 through Amazon.

Accepted papers will be distributed to the other members of your seminar group, and **each participant agrees to read the others' papers of your seminar group before** coming in November. The **maximum length** is ten double-spaced pages. Since we are using the seminar format, attendance is limited.
